OBITUARIES

John Goodman (Goodie)

John Goodman, or Goodie as he was known to us all, was involved in Cricket in Nelson for nearly 75 years, from playing in his primary school years to reading notes last week in preparation for a board meeting. I will briefly summarise Goodies' involvement as a player, coach, manager, administrator and mentor spanning eight decades.

As a player at Nelson College, John occasionally played for the Nelson College 1st XI

- He played for and coached the Nelson College seconds and thirds as a 17 year old
- Coaching was where he felt his best contribution was made and he really enjoyed it
- Assisting others rather than himself started at an early age.
- He captained, played for and coached the Christchurch Teachers College XI during his period in Christchurch, primarily developing his coaching and organisational skills
- Prior to 1967 in Nelson, John played for Old Boys Cricket Club
- He played for Athletics Old Boys Cricket Club from 1967 to 1969
- He also played for Ramblers Cricket Club and is still a member



As a coach/manager he held several roles and was very successful with team and player development.

- He was an Athletics Old Boys Club coach
- He filled several roles for Nelson College as a coach, manager or teacher in charge for a lengthy period from 1996 through to 2007
- Goodie was coach of Nelson Primary Schools' rep team from 1969 to 1976. During that period, the Nelson Primary Schools team won three South Island titles. The Sir Jack Newman Trophy is highly regarded, and successful teams need to be well organised and coached.
- John also coached numerous school and age group teams.
- During that period John coached and mentored various players who went on to represent New Zealand including Andrew Jones, Tony Blain and Jock Edwards. There is wide acknowledgment by several of the more successful Nelson players of Goodie's contribution to their successes.



As an administrator, John was heavily involved in cricket. This included being a member of committees, boards, and taking a 'hands on' approach with various duties, which even extended on occasions to ground preparation. He was known for rolling up his sleeves and getting the job done.

- He was Master in Charge of Cricket at Nelson College
- A Rambler Cricket Club committee member to the present day
- Athletic Old Boys administrator and club captain
- Inaugural patron of the Athletic Cricket Old Boys Club from 2006 to the present day
- Vice President of Nelson Cricket from 2000 to 2005
- President of Nelson Cricket from 2006 to the present day
- And a past President of Central Districts Cricket 2013, 2014

It is in his role as President of Nelson Cricket that I have personally had more recent dealings with John.

John is a gentleman of the highest order, whose first thoughts were for others and how he can assist them.

- This is epitomised by an interaction we had during December when John was undergoing treatment in Christchurch. We were very keen for him to attend the Black Caps international against Bangladesh. Unfortunately, he had to decline due to his health, but sent me an apologetic email. He was most concerned that he could not fulfil his official duties as President of Nelson Cricket and assist as a host to our visitors.

That is simply John to a tee.
Not about him !!

- Another anecdote worth mentioning involved our lengthy process of updating the very much out of date constitution. A lot of people were involved, but none more than Goodie. As President under the former constitution, he as President had significant duties and responsibilities including involvement in board meetings and voting rights. We wished to update the constitution inline

with modern documents such as those adopted by New Zealand Cricket and Central Districts. One of the differences in the modern constitutions are that the Presidents are generally regarded as a figurehead and are not given voting rights. Several of the board were more than apprehensive about adopting or discussing this issue. True to his nature, John front footed the issue before anybody had a chance and stated that 'voting rights should be removed from the President as you don't want an old fuddy duddy being involved in important decisions'. We most certainly did not agree with his self-description. We always listened to and respected every comment or suggestion made at board level by John. He was a stickler for facts and a traditionalist and when disagreeing with a proposal, or suggestion, always made a considered and rationale rebuttal or argument.

- Ironically, he was the one person on the board that could list the past year's obituaries and give a full account of the individual's history. Unfortunately, John's name will be front and centre at this year's AGM.

- He also put us to shame with his IT skills. John used his iPad for all meeting documents and notes.
- As a traditionalist John was fairly vocal in his disapproval of the movement of Nelson Cricket from Trafalgar Park. Several very successful Hawke Cup campaigns were completed on Trafalgar Park and John did not see the move to Saxton Field as benefiting Nelson Cricket. It maybe also had something to do with being a much longer drive to Saxton Oval from Weka Street.
- Over the past few years while attending Nelson representative games, Central Districts fixtures, New Zealand A fixtures, White Fern games and Black Cap Internationals,

John had been a proud and hardworking Nelson Cricket host to all teams, players and officials. He was very proud to wear the Nelson Cricket Association shirt at these fixtures and functions, no more so than when wearing it with his white gloves and delivering the real Cricket World Cup to its plinth on Saxton Oval. I believe he had become proud of Saxton Oval as the home of Nelson Cricket.

- All cricketers, administrators and coaches in Nelson will miss seeing John's white Suzuki parked in a prominent vantage point around the cricket grounds of Nelson. He was committed to all aspects of our game, a true gentleman who will be sadly missed.

Nelson Cricket received an email from Ed Shuttleworth from the ICC, who eloquently said..

"In any situation John brought a sense of calm, kindness, clear thinking and importantly brought us back to the spirit of the game.

John is the essence of community sport and I cannot imagine the loss felt across the entire community."

2017 NCA CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

With the exception of the passing of John Goodman, 2017 has been very successful for Nelson Cricket. We were fortunate to be given the opportunity by the family to speak at John's funeral. I was given the honour of outlining John's amazing life involvement in cricket. A copy of the obituary is attached. John's involvement is certainly missed by all.

Staff changes have continued during this year. Aldin Smith, who was recruited as our head coach has taken a role with CD. Jon Routhan, who was our Manager of Club Cricket, left to take a Sports Coordinator role at Nelson College for Girls. We all thank Jon for his considerable effort and passion in his various roles working for Nelson Cricket. Jon, for a change can relax and enjoy an international at Saxton Oval this summer.

Ruan Louw, who was initially employed as Manager of Club cricket to replace Jon, has taken over the Head of Coaching role left vacant with Aldin's departure. Ruan has extensive coaching qualifications and experience. With these considerable changes David Leonard our General Manager, has to periodically cover a variety of roles. We thank all staff for their efforts, and especially David for his efforts. We also welcomed Gavin Larsen to our team. Gavin has taken

over expanding our commercial activities and sponsorship opportunities.

The 2016/17 fixtures at Saxton Oval were all run very efficiently and considered successful. Our relationships with Nelson City Council, Central Districts and New Zealand Cricket, are very important to us, and considerable effort is put in to maintain and build on these. I would also like to sincerely thank all the volunteers involved. Without their efforts and enthusiasm we would not be able to bring National and International cricket to the top of the south.

This summer we have a Super Smash T20 match, one international T20 against the West Indies, the New Zealand A warm up match against Pakistan and the opening one dayer against Pakistan. Continued use of Saxton Oval as a boutique first class and international venue is a key aim of NCA.

The "clubs as a hub" initiative has been adopted and New Zealand cricket are interested in its success. This initiative is progressing well with all clubs embracing the strategy. This has been slightly slowed by changes in staff, but is envisaged to gain momentum when a permanent position is filled in the new year.

The ethos behind hosting internationals is clear. To bring quality cricket to the top of the south, while generating income to put back into the local game. Although it may appear that the benefits to Nelson Cricket are mainly economic, this is far from the truth. Through successfully running of these fixtures we can reduce reliance on funding applications for core work. We can redistribute that income to the clubs and to building and maintaining world class facilities. Developing additional income streams around these fixtures and our facilities is part of Gavin's role.

During 2016 we completed our state of the art indoor practise facility. This facility completes Saxton Oval cricket, as the pre-eminent regional cricket facility. We should be very proud of this total facility and all the people of the years who have been involved in its development. The managing and efficient utilisation of this facility remains a major focus.

Our GM and Coaches reports highlight team and personal accolades and achievements. I would like to thank all the officials. Without our small and dwindling pool of umpires and scorers, senior and some second grade teams would have a lot more work to do on Saturdays. Part of the healthy clubs initiative is also focussed on connection with past players and people keen to be involved from a non-playing perspective.

Thank you all for being part of Nelson Cricket. Your combined efforts to bring cricket to all our community as very much appreciated.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

2016-17 was another significant and busy season for Nelson Cricket.

International Cricket

We hosted another “double header” with two ODI’s between the Black Caps and Bangladesh. Unfortunately the scheduling was not overly kind to us with two games a day apart being the same format and opposition. We have very little input into scheduling and with the window for Saxton Oval being the Christmas / New Year period and “double headers” being significantly more economical to host and service it is likely we will see these into the future. With Saxton Oval capacity being at the low end of the minimum requirement we will continue to only host the “second tier” nations. Unfortunately crowd numbers were down for both games. It is essential that these events are supported in Nelson by Nelsonians and visitors. We have one of these best venues in the country albeit one of the smallest from a capacity perspective. The strategy for allocating games to the likes of Saxton Oval is around “taking games to where the people are”. If people don’t go to games this questions this strategy.

International events cornerstone Nelson Cricket on a number of fronts:

1. Promoting, developing and giving cricket a profile in the region. Nelson Cricket could not afford and it close to achieving the benefits of hosting the BLACKCAPS and international class cricket. It places cricket front and centre from a sporting perspective in the summer months in Nelson.
2. Financial – The work load and focus for these events cornerstones Nelson Cricket’s “investment” into the community game. The community game benefited to date through the completion of the Indoor Facility and the implementation of CLUB HUB. Without these events Nelson Cricket could have achieved what it has or commit to what it has.

I would like to acknowledge the work and effort put in by Regan Sinclair and Devon Serrurier being our new ground staff and their team from Nelmac for the work they put in to prepare the venue to a very high standard. In order to set up, host and operate an international fixture means an awful of work by a large number of people. From volunteers through to contractors and suppliers I would like to thank you all for the work you put in achieve another outstanding event.

This year we also hosted the White Ferns in ODI's against Pakistan in both ODI's and a T20. Although not attended by large numbers of spectators these games were of high quality and really showcased the skills in women's cricket.

First Class Cricket

Central Districts continue to utilise Saxton Oval for all formats of first class cricket with us particularly finding a niche around early season Plunket Shield cricket and holiday season SUPERSMASH T20.

This was Nelson's first challenge since the 2011-12 season. Late in the season Nelson also won back the Newman shield with an emphatic performance in Blenheim. Club and Community Cricket

After another successful season where playing numbers across all areas is at record highs and the implementation of the CLUB HUB programme. In year 1 CLUB HUB has been a success achieving more than we had envisaged. I would like to congratulate the six premier clubs for being open and engaging in the process. I would like to thank Jon Routhan for passionately embracing and partnering with clubs to drive this. There will be challenges along the way but we believe that for clubs to thrive in today's environment they need to be skilled, engaged and connected to their community. They must understand development and areas of the game that they have largely not been involved in previously.





Indoor Facility

It has been a massive year constructing, fitting out and getting the indoor facility operational. This has been a complex and time consuming project but now have a facility that can operate “unmanned, is accessible to any in the community and allows Nelson Cricket to organise and run high quality coaching programs.

The “fit-out” is world class and is a massive investment for Nelson Cricket. The netting system and configuration is the best in New Zealand provides many options on the setup of the facility. The LED lighting although initially more expensive than other options the ongoing and running costs are significantly cheaper.

The completion of the online booking system completes the accessibility and we will shortly be launching a membership scheme for users.

Head Coach

Aldin started with us in September and has transformed the way the Griffins operate. In line with our “Long Term Athlete Development Plan” (LTADP) our focus has been to develop skill. A huge focus has been on increased skill sessions which has been seen as an increased engagement from players and an increase in play skill level and performance.

Community Cricket Manager

During the year Jon resigned from Nelson Cricket. I would like to thank him for his work over the past 5 years, his enthusiasm for the game and developing the game in our region. During his time we have seen significant growth in the junior game.

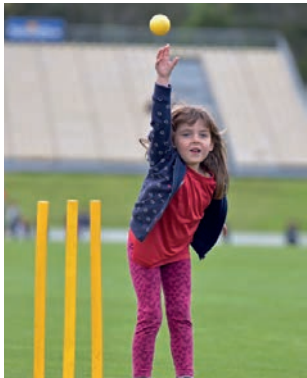

Strategic initiatives

There was one aspect that we pursued as a team for the season and I honestly believed that this allowed us to achieve some good results within a limited time period. We wanted to bring back the pride in representing Nelson Cricket, because I personally felt that there was no meaning in representing the team. Having values as a squad that we believed in, worked and strived towards meant that we started to unify and work together towards a common purpose.

The goal was simple, focus on the everyday processes and the rest will take care of itself, be consistent and buy into the values of the team and not once did we ever focus on winning, winning was merely the outcome of the hard work that the players put into their games behind the scenes. We were very fortunate to also have our leaders, who played at a higher level, buy into our vision and lead by example from the front with major contributions at crucial times.

The season started with very little preparation and a limited squad after a number of players had retired, in Napier at Chapple Cup. Having been in the job for 4 weeks, I found the next month to be a massive learning curve but also the turning point for the team.

We played 3 games at Chapple Cup and lost 2 winning only one with a crushing defeat where we were bowled out for a mere 36, a scorecard that would be a driving force for us as a team as we progressed through the season. We played a two-day friendly against Mid Canterbury, which saw a very young and inexperienced team get out onto the park, but welcomed a player that would be an important part of the team for the season, after not playing representative cricket for a number of years.

After a demoralizing defeat at home against Marlborough in the Newman Shield, the chat in the change room was not about how badly we had played, but rather about how we should trust and embrace the processes that we would put into place, to ensure that we move forward as a team. We had a meeting as a team and put together our values and what we want to achieve and how we would be doing that. We all unanimously agreed with,

“Leave the Griffin in a better place than what you found it in”

The training regime changed and we started training 3 times a week, including players investing time in small group and individual sessions with the aim of further developing and improving. Players started

to understand the importance of preparation and how precise it needs to be because they started to see the difference.

By creating an identity, being part of a group working towards a goal in an environment that promotes values and processes, players were prepared to embrace it because there was a purpose and sense of pride.

Once you start doing the small things extraordinarily well, the bigger things always seem to take care of themselves. The focus was solely on the Griffins because once that was established and in a good space, it would be so much easier to start putting a structure into place, that would allow the growth of players throughout the region without the entire structure being dependent on one coach.

The next step was to educate coaches to allow them to contribute in the development of players correctly and to have a better understanding of the level that players need to be at and what it is that will allow players to develop and grow.

Outcomes

By creating the right environment and having the focus of players on processes, you start developing players that value their environment, take pride in their work ethic and because of that will be more confident when taking the field simply because they know that they have put in the work and have paid their dues, earned confidence. By training in having two net sessions per week, all you achieve is having perceived confidence.

Understanding and knowing that representing Nelson is bigger than the individual, allows players to buy into team values and once that is achieved players put in those individual performances because they want the team to do well and not from a selfish point of view.

Creating a Nelson Griffins group with this mindset and work ethic was important not only for the group but for the club cricket in Nelson. Players would hopefully allow our values as a team and how we train be the attitudes they take back to their various clubs, therefore uplifting the standard throughout the region. This is however not an overnight miracle unfortunately, but a process that needs to be nurtured and encouraged the whole time.
